

Universal Infant Free School Meals – Free School Meals

What's the difference? Who gets a voucher? How Do I Apply?

Universal Infant Free School Meals were introduced by the government in 2014 to give all children, regardless of their economic background, a meal at school at lunchtime. It was a great idea to give all children a hot meal at school helping many families by saving them dinner money or money buying food to make packed lunches. It was for everyone – no application needed!

Free School Meals have been around for much longer than this. They were introduced many years ago to help low income families. Parents had to apply for this benefit and were eligible due to certain benefits they obtained.

More recently, the government linked this means tested benefit, to providing additional money to support children in school called **Pupil Premium**. The school get additional pupil premium money into their budget based on the numbers of pupils eligible to free school meals.

This has led to some understandable confusion. Only parents who have a means tested, registered entitlement to free school meals will get the £15 voucher.

Q: I've lost my job - How do I know if I am entitled now?

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

Your child may also get free school meals if you get any of these benefits and your child is both:

- younger than the <u>compulsory age for starting school</u>
- in full-time education

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2022.

- · Your own name and date of birth
- Contact details. Includes e-mail. phone numbers and address details. It is helpful to have an e-mail and correct postcode.
- National Insurance Number or National Asylum Seekers Number
- Child's name and date of birth
- School your child is attending/will attend.

To apply the steps are:

- Income Support
 Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit


4. Add your address. It is helpful to have the correct postcode.




5. Add your child's details. Please make sure that they are correct because these will be checked against the school's records.

Easiest way you can find your child's school by using the name list option and searching the dropdown list.

When you are ready, click Save and Continue.



Remember that you can save and continue with your application at any point.



Note that you can add siblings onto this application. This is done after you have submitted it. There is an option on the final page if your application is approved. You do not have to input all personal details again. The system will not automatically add siblings to new applications.

Q: I've been furloughed and my income has fallen - I might be entitled now?

Online application is the easiest way to apply. If you need assistance with your status you may need to contact the relevant benefits department (e.g universal credit, child tax benefit etc).

If you are not entitled now, once the school has the relevant details from you and enters it into the system, you will automatically be notified if you become entitled to means tested free school meals. In the meantime, there may be other sources of support available to you in the community. School and council may be able to support you with a manual check if the government's systems are not updated.

Your child's school wants to help you with this but can only allocate the vouchers according to the government criteria. You need to provide the information to help them check if you qualify.
