

What is Accelerated Reader?



- It is an online program that children use to take a quiz after they have read a book.
- Children can read real books or online books using MyOn.
- Accelerated Reader will assess the child's reading level so that they can choose books at the correct challenge level for them.
- Teachers use AR to monitor reading progress.



What is Accelerated Reader?





Allocate

20 -35 minutes
of daily reading
practice



on any platform with Internet access Schedule time to analyse the data

Regular access

to books



Quiz within 24 hours of finishing the book

Why are we using AR?



- To improve reading fluency by building children up to reading gradually;
- To develop a love of books and reading;
- To improve understanding;
- To develop language acquisition;
- To support home learning.

 According to Renaissance Learning's research, children who read <u>at least</u> 20 minutes a day with a 90% comprehension rate on AR quizzes see the greatest gains.





ZPD – Zone Proximal Development

Common sense tells us that whenever we practise a skill, we will get the most from our efforts if we work at the right level. Practising with books that are too hard results in frustration. Practising with books that are too easy does little to improve skills and leads to boredom.

Based on a concept developed by Russian psychologist Lev Vygotsky, the ZPD represents the level of difficulty that is neither too hard nor too easy, and is the level at which optimal learning takes place.

All children have completed a reading assessment which gives them a ZPD level. Your child's teacher will inform you of this level.

If their level is 2.4 - 3.5 we would suggest that they start with books at 2.4 and work up through the levels.


- There are lots of popular books on Accelerated Reader.

- ZPD's are a guide an do not put children off if they really want to read a book outside of their level. Discuss their choices with them – sometimes children need to be guided and encouraged to try different books.


AR Quizzes



 Once children have read their book they should log onto Accelerated Reader and click on the Orange icon.




Type the name of the book into the search bar.



- Click on the book check it's the correct name and author.
- Follow the Quiz instructions.

AR Quizzes






- Children only take a quiz <u>after</u> they have *finished* a book.
- There are usually about 10 questions on the book that has been read. At the end of the quiz the students are given a percentage to show them how well they have done.
- There are some important rules for taking quizzes:
- 1) The book the child is quizzed on <u>must be a book they have</u> <u>read in the last two weeks</u>. AR is not a memory test but rather measuring reading ability.
- 2) A student cannot take a quiz until they have read the entire text.
- 3) Quizzes must be done individually, not with anyone's help.

Exploring AR





- Using these three icons the children can explore how they scored on their quizzes, which books they have read and the progress that they have made.
- They love to see the books build up on the bookshelf.
- The teachers in school will also be able to monitor the progress the children are making at home.
